



Basic Orton-Gillingham Structured Literacy Instruction

This training is for parents and tutors wanting to homeschool or tutor a reader who is dyslexic or experiencing reading, writing, and spelling difficulties.

In this class you will learn to assess and teach using proven techniques based on the Orton-Gillingham structured, systematic, sequential, and multisensory instructional methods. The course demonstrates how to build phonological awareness (hearing sounds), decoding (sounding out words), encoding (spelling), fluency (reading smoothly at an appropriate pace), vocabulary (how to learn new words) and comprehension (understanding what is read).

Instructor: Sandy Stark is an educator with a Master's Degree from Doane University. She has 36 years of elementary teaching experience. As a title 1 reading teacher, she incorporated a multisensory approach into the reading curriculum. She is trained and has taught Orton-Gillingham Basic Literature, A-Z Phonics/Project Read, VoWac and Comprehensive Multisensory Reading. Sandy is a member of the Nebraska Dyslexia Association and serves on the Board of Directors.

Fees: \$185 tuition plus \$75 for materials. Registration is due September 9, 2020. Register early as registration is limited to 6.
